#### New Year Celebration 2063 & AGM

The program, held in a community hall in Melbourne, was attended by hundreds of Nepalese including mostly children and their parents. The program which was organised for the second time in Melbourne, Australia, was aimed at bringing together children of Nepalese families living in Melbourne and to nurture Nepalese culture amongst the ever-growing new generation of Nepalese.

To keep the children busy for the day, various games and activities were organised including art drawing, picture colouring, passing the parcel, musical chair and mini-football. Children wearing Nepalese costume showed their catwalk skills in the first ever Kids Fashion Parade.

#### Dashain Tihar 2006: Recreating Memories of Nepal


Dashain and Tihar (festival of light) are two such auspicious national festivals in the Nepalese annual calendar, celebrated by Nepalese of all caste and creed throughout the country. To mark the occasion, NAV organised the event "Dashain Tihar 2006" on Saturday, 22 October 2006 at Hawthorn Town Hall in Hawthorn. The festival this year is themed "Dashain Tihar 2006: Recreating Memories of Nepal."

The highlight of the day-long festival was colourful, vibrant and powerful cultural performances by various artists in Victoria. The program included Indigenous dances, traditional Nepalese dance performed by local artists. The cultural program was clearly aimed to celebrate rich multiculturalism in Victorian.

The Brunswick Blues claimed the victory after a nail-bitting finish. NAV president Ranjan Vaidya presented winners with the NAV cup and medals.
